

Steps You Can Take After Sexual Assault

Check list for adults who have been subjected to sexual violence



Call 110!

If you have been targeted with a sexual offence, alarm the police directly via the free emergency number 110. You can also go to a police station. We recommend that you immediately report the crime to ensure your safety, but also prevent the loss of evidence. Certain substances (e.g. knockout drugs, a.k.a. "roofies" or "date rape drugs") can only be detected in the body for a few hours.

Forensic Medical Examination in Hospital

- If possible, ask someone you trust to support you and stay at your side.
- The police will accompany you to the emergency department of one of the following hospitals that is specialized in forensic examination and documentation:

You can also visit these emergency departments independently of the police. It is also possible to contact the police via the hospital.

You can seek emergency medical care at any hospital emergency department.

Preserving Evidence - Steps you can take

To prevent the loss of evidence, please observe the following:

- Even if it's difficult, try not to wash or shower before evidence has been recorded and secured.
- Keep original sanitary products worn at the time of the crime, such as panty liners or tampons. Do not wash worn clothing until evidence has been secured. The same applies to other textiles that are connected to the incident, such as bedding and towels.
- If you had prior contact with the perpetrator on social media (i.e. Snapchat, Tinder, Instagram, Whats-App, etc.), take screenshots. Do not delete chats or files that were exchanged. Digital traces, as listed below, can be used as evidence in court proceedings:
 - ☐ The suspect's telephone number

Chat histories

- □ E-Mail addresses
- Photos/videos that were sent or received

Police Interview

You will be interviewed by the police officers on duty. To help the police officers understand what has happened, you will be asked questions including the following:

- What happened?
- Where did it happen?
- Who was involved?
- Were there witnesses?
- Is there any evidence?

Answering these questions will ensure that the investigation can be conducted successfully. Don't worry if you can't remember something. You can make notes beforehand.
